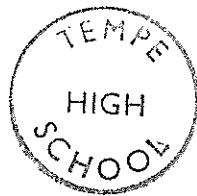

In the Interactive documentary 'SBS Online Cronulla Riots: The Day that Shocked a Nation' there is a multimedia option called 'About me' this option is a background check into the lives of the people who were affected by the Riots, but the Riots don't define them as the 'about me' section proves. *Wendy Joyce* one of the people interviewed for the *interactive documentary* was Mecca La La she told her story and how the riots affected her and made her feel. But upon clicking her 'about me' section the viewer can discover much more about Mecca, she was the first female Muslim lifesaver, tracked on the treacherous trail of Kokoda along side Prime Minister Scott Morrison and is working to help the Muslim community. With all this extra information about Mecca *the viewer would feel a sense of respect and admiration that they most likely feel as much if this were just a traditional documentary and her information only brushed the surface.*

While watching the interactive documentary 'Survey' questions pop up on the lower side of the screen, asking questions relating to the theme of the documentary, questions such as: "Have you ever experienced bullying?" "Yes, No, Sometimes Never" are the possible answers the viewer may click to answer the survey. Upon clicking an answer the viewer is lead to a video of a university professor speaking on the topic of the question, they share statistics of how Australians across the nation have answered this question.

This interactive tool puts the viewer in making them feel like they are not alone, being assured by a professor on an outstanding issue can be very comforting, but that being said the viewer can also ignore the 'Survey' question all together and continue on their way. It is up to the viewer, the freedom of their documentary is all in a click.
